Modern-Day Slavery: Human Trafficking

The Atlanta chapter of Amnesty International will be hosting a forum about Modern-Day Slavery: Human Trafficking, Wednesday, 11/19, 6:30 p.m. in the Crescent Room in the Georgia Tech Student Center. As the Amnesty website says, "Human trade, slave markets, the buying and selling of people—these are words and phrases that, to many people, echo a brutal and distant time in our past. But to the countless women, men, and children trafficked every year, these words coldly define the horror of their lives. Trafficking is a global phenomenon where victims are sexually exploited, forced into labor, and subjected to abuse."

Speakers will include Alia El-Sawi, Anti-Human Trafficking Program Coordinator for Tapestri, an organization dedicated to ending violence and oppression in refugee and immigrant communities; Mark Horner, the Georgia State Director of the Not for Sale Campaign, and a campaign of people from various divergent backgrounds united to fight the global slave trade; and Kirsten Widner, post-doctoral fellow at the Barton Child Law and Policy Clinic, and a board member of Rescue and Restore and others.
